II. GENERAL INFO ABOUT EUSA

1.About EUSA

The European University Sports Association (EUSA) is an umbrella organization that comprises National University Sports Associations (NUSA) from 47 European countries, providing sporting activities, educational events, and expertise in policy making and programming.

The organization is well known within the sector as a safe and strong voice for university sports in Europe, promoting fair play values and supporting their membership by partnering with European Sports Federations and lobbying within the European Union, the Council of Europe, and other institutions for funding to improve the provision of sport. EUSA is a proud and active associated member of the International University Sports Federation (FISU), strategically cooperating also with other Continental University Sports Federations (CUSF), as well as key governing bodies and organisations active in the field of sport, education, and youth.

Since its founding in 1999, EUSA has organised 16 seasons of the European Universities Championships, attracting student-athletes to 204 university competitions held across Europe. In five previous editions of the European Universities Games, around 19.500 student- athletes from across Europe have participated in the different sporting competitions organised during these multi-sports events.

Through its Institute, EUSA also engages in several social responsibility projects and initiatives on various topics, including Anti-Doping, Dual Career, Equal Opportunities and Inclusion, Good Governance, Mobility, Safeguarding, Skills Development, Sustainability, and Volunteering. Many of the projects are supported by the European Union.

2.EUSA EC, Commissions, and Office

Highest body is the General Assembly, composed of representatives of the member associations, electing the Executive Committee. Its members are responsible for the administration and running of EUSA and the execution of main directives taken by the Assembly. The EUSA Executive Committee is led by the President, Adam Roczek, 1st Vice President, four Vice-Presidents, Treasurer and Secretary General.

Various EUSA commissions are in place to provide assistance and guidance to the many different activities EUSA is involved in. These commissions include the Technical Commission, Control Commission, Education Commission, Inclusion and Diversity Commission, Medical Commission, Student Commission, Branding and Marketing Council and also other working bodies.

EUSA's headquarters is located in Ljubljana, Slovenia, where a dedicated team of 12 staff members plus 4 volunteers/interns work together to manage daily operations and oversee international activities. As part of the European University Sports Association (EUSA), they play a vital role in supporting the development and promotion of university sports across Europe, ensuring smooth coordination of events, effective communication, and strong collaboration among member organizations.

1.About Host Country

Portugal is a country known for its rich culture, fascinating history, and stunning natural beauty. 2.About Host City



Welcome to Coimbra!

Coimbra is a city known for its deep cultural roots, academic tradition, and timeless charm. Once the capital of Portugal, it is home to one of the oldest universities in Europe, the University of Coimbra, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

The city is famous for its student culture, historic architecture, and the haunting sounds of Coimbra Fado, a unique variation of Portugal's traditional music. With its scenic views over the Mondego River, cobble streets, and the centuries-old Joanina Library, Coimbra beautifully blends history, learning, and vibrant city life.

3.University Sport in the Host Country

The Academic Federation of University Sports (FADU) is a Sports Federation that focuses on sport as a tool for education and personal development. It was born from a movement of several academic institutions across the country with the aim of promoting, encouraging, and organizing sports within Higher Education.

Founded on March 2, 1990, FADU has held the status of Public Utility in Sports since 1995. Over the years, it has grown significantly, both in terms of organized activities and number of participants, and is now considered one of the largest sports federations in the country.

Currently, more than 8,000 registered athletes compete under its umbrella, across 50 individual and team sports, involving over 100 clubs and 500 teams. Each year, FADU organizes 76 National University Championships and 48 Regional Championships, officially awarding 307 university national titles, and culminating in the University Sports Gala, which honors the year's top performers.

Throughout its history, FADU has worked to earn credibility both nationally and internationally. Evidence of this is its role as an associate member of the Portuguese Olympic Committee (COP), the Portuguese Sports Confederation (CDP), the Portuguese Paralympic Committee (CPP), the National Youth Council (CNJ), and international institutions such as the European University Sports Association (EUSA) and the International University Sports Federation (FISU).

FADU is one of the most active university sports federations in Europe and has been recognized with the award for the most active federation by EUSA on five occasions – in 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017, and 2018.

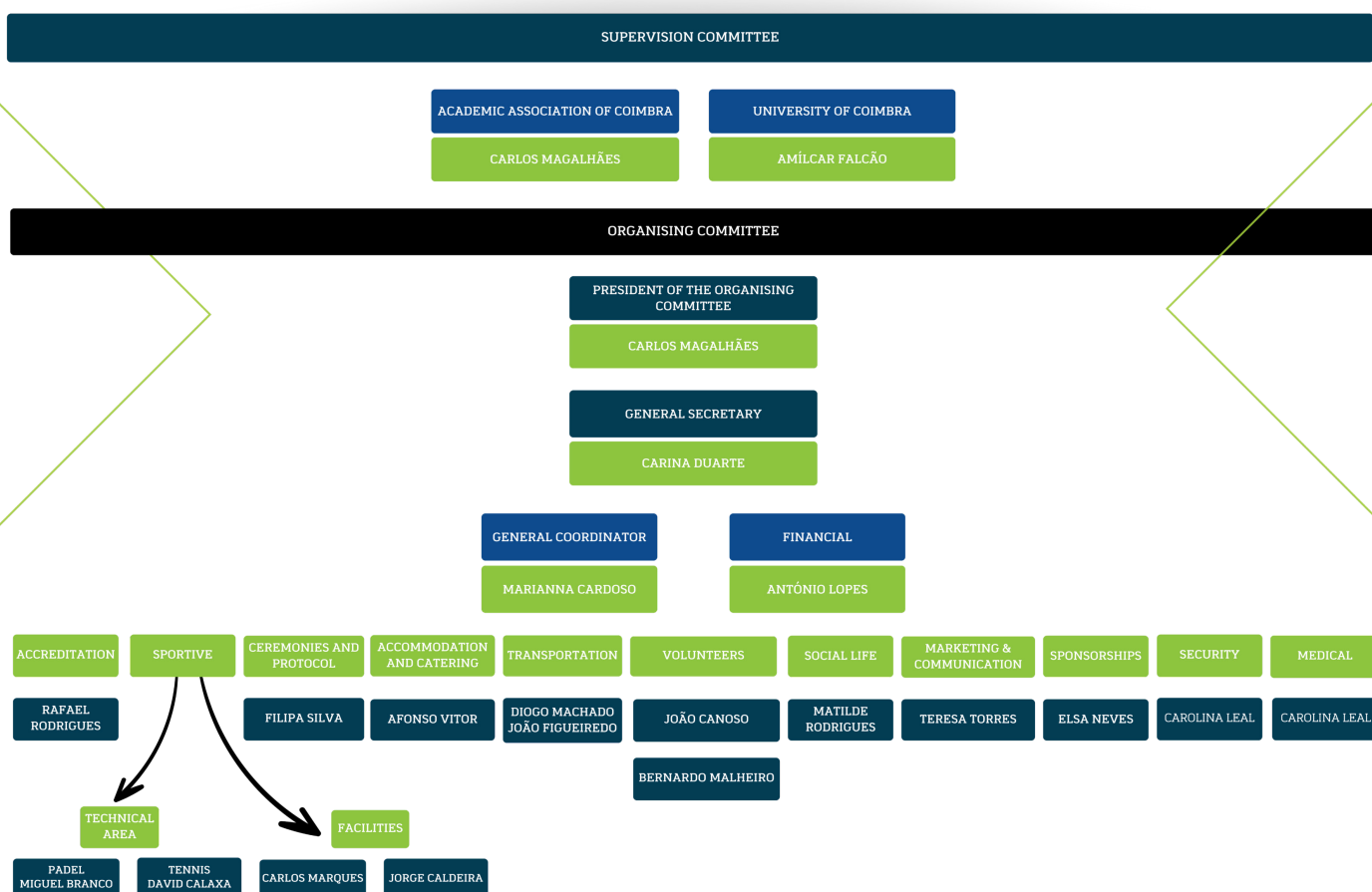

6. Useful Information

Useful Information for Your Visit to Portugal

When visiting Portugal for the European Universities Tennis and Padel Championships, here's what you need to know:

- **Language:** Portuguese is the official language. English is widely understood in tourist areas.
- **Time Zone:** Western European Time (UTC+0) in winter and Western European Summer Time (UTC+1) in summer.
- **Currency:** Euro (€).
- **Payments:** Credit/debit cards and contactless payments are widely accepted. ATMs are common, but carry some cash for small purchases.
- **Emergency Number:** Dial 112 for police, fire, or medical emergencies.
- **Electricity:** 230V, 50Hz. Plug types C and F—bring an adapter if needed.

Weather in Coimbra - July & August

During July and August, Coimbra experiences hot and dry summer weather.

Temperatures: Daytime highs often reach 35°C (95°F), while mornings and evenings are milder, around 20°C (68°F).

- **Sunshine:** Expect lots of sun and very little rain—perfect for outdoor activities.
- **Evenings:** Cooler and more comfortable, ideal for exploring the city.
- **Humidity:** Usually moderate, but dry conditions can make the heat feel more intense.
- **Rain:** August is one of the driest months, with almost no rainfall.

Stay hydrated and use sun protection during the hottest hours!

1. Transportation

Transfers from Airports, Train Station, and Bus Terminal

Transfers will be provided only from Francisco Sá Carneiro Airport, Coimbra-B Train Station, and Coimbra Bus Terminal to the accommodation centers at Polo II -1 and Polo II -2 residences. Transfers will be made by special buses, according to the participants' arrival and departure schedules.

Transfers from the official welcome points (Francisco Sá Carneiro Airport, Coimbra-B Train Station, and Coimbra Bus Terminal) will only be available on Sunday, 27th July, from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

Transfers from the accommodation centers to Francisco Sá Carneiro Airport, Coimbra-B Train Station, and Coimbra Bus Terminal will only be available on Saturday, 2nd August, from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

2. Medical and Security Services

Throughout the competition, qualified physiotherapists will be permanently present to support all athletes.

We maintain direct contact with the local healthcare unit, namely Hospital da Universidade de Coimbra, ensuring rapid referral and medical intervention if necessary. Additionally, a designated official doctor is available to oversee and accompany any athlete requiring further medical attention.



3. Accreditation Procedure

The accreditation process at the European Universities Championships ensures each participant is clearly identified, assigned a role, and given access only to necessary areas. This system, set by EUSA and managed by the Organising Committee (OC), helps safely and efficiently handle all involved individuals. For the 2025 Championships in Coimbra, the OC is responsible for creating and distributing accreditation badges and lanyards at the Accreditation Center.

4. Accommodation

The **Polo II-1 and Polo II-2 Residences** will provide accommodation for participants and officials of the European Universities Tennis and Padel Championship 2025. These student residences are located in the Polo II campus of the University of Coimbra, close to the Faculties of Engineering, Science, and Technology. Each residence provides double rooms, all equipped with a study area, Wi-Fi access (credentials provided upon arrival), and access to common lounges and laundry facilities.



Hotel Mondego will accommodate the tennis and padel referees during the European Universities Tennis and Padel Championship 2025. Located in the center of Coimbra, close to the historic city center, train station, and Tennis Venue, the hotel offers comfort and convenience. Recently renovated, it features modern single and double rooms equipped with air conditioning, Wi-Fi, private bathrooms, and TV. A buffet breakfast is included. The hotel provides a quiet, welcoming environment, ideal for referees to relax and prepare for their important role in the championship.

5. Laundry Service

The laundry rooms are located on the ground floor of each residence.

If you want to use the laundry service, you'll need to register on the app (<https://sasuc.go.uc.pt/login/>) and load it in the cafeteria.

The app must be topped up with a minimum of 5 euros (amounts loaded onto the app are non-refundable).

In each laundry room you will find more detailed instructions on how to use them.

6. Catering

Meals at Complexo Alimentar Polo II

A healthy diet is essential to perform at your best when competing. That's why the University of Coimbra, through its canteen service, provides daily meals from Monday to Sunday at the Complexo Alimentar Polo II.

This daily menu ensures a balanced and varied diet for all participants in the European Universities Tennis and Padel Championship 2025.

The competition menu will be carefully curated according to the allergens, intolerances, and dietary restrictions indicated by each athlete and official in their Individual Entry Forms (IEFs).

- **Lunch: 11:30 AM - 3:00 PM**
- **Dinner: 6:30 PM - 9:15 PM**

7. Insurance

The delegations shall have the appropriate insurance to cover their travel and participation in the EUC. Each participant must have an international health insurance during their stay in the event and must arrange this prior to their arrival at the EUC event. Neither EUSA nor OC will be liable for any costs arising from their failure to follow this regulation.

During the accreditation, each delegation will sign a declaration in which they will assume full responsibility for this matter.

In addition, we recommend that all participants request the European Health Insurance Card. The European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) allows you to receive medical assistance during a temporary stay in a country of the European Union. Medical care is provided through that country's social security system, which means that some health care may not be free of charge and may require the payment of user fees.

8. Safety and Security rules

To ensure a safe and smooth-running event for all participants, staff, and spectators, the following safety and security rules will apply:

1. Access Control

All accredited individuals must wear their official accreditation badges at all times within the sports facilities. Entry to restricted areas is permitted only to authorised personnel.

2. Emergency Procedures

In case of emergency, please follow the instructions of event staff and security personnel immediately. Evacuation plans will be clearly displayed in all facilities.

3. Medical Support

Qualified physiotherapists will be on-site at all times (one per sports infrastructure) to provide immediate assistance. A designated event doctor is available, and we maintain direct contact with Coimbra Hospital for any urgent medical needs.

4. First Aid and Incident Reporting

Report any injuries, security incidents, or suspicious behaviour to the nearest staff member or security guard without delay.

5. Prohibited Items

Weapons, illegal substances, and any items considered dangerous are strictly prohibited within the venues.

6. Conduct Expectations

All participants and spectators are expected to behave respectfully towards each other, staff, officials, and security personnel. Any form of aggression, harassment, or misconduct will not be tolerated and may result in removal from the premises.

9. Info Centre

The Info Centre is located at the EUC Headquarters (University Stadium) and will provide all general information about the event.

The Info Centre hours of operation will be from **08:00 till 20:00**. In this place, all the participants will be guided, if necessary, to the responsible person of each specific area.

2. Sports Regulations for Other Awards

All award winners must attend the Awards Ceremony, which will only take place if at least one medalist or their official representative is present. During the ceremony, athletes and officials must follow strict rules: no national, political, cultural, or religious symbols or slogans are allowed on the podium, nor can any related audio or video be used. Participants are required to wear their official university uniforms at the Opening, Closing, and Award ceremonies, and to remove any caps when receiving medals, holding them in hand throughout.

After the ceremony, all medalists should be available for media interviews. Certificates of participation will be prepared for every athlete, official, and volunteer, and distributed by Heads of Delegation on the last day before the final competition, subject to prior approval by the EUSA Office.

3. Awards Ceremony (protocol, place, time etc.)

Medal Award Ceremony - August 3 | Tennis Outdoor Venue

The Medal Award Ceremony will take place approximately 15 minutes after the finals conclude, with an estimated duration of 20 minutes.

Summary:

The ceremony begins with the seating of VIPs and venue preparation. Medal presentations follow, first for the Women's Competition (bronze, silver, gold), then for the Men's Competition (bronze, silver, gold), with medals delivered by OC/FADU/Government and EUSA representatives. After all winners are on the podium, the EUSA anthem is played. The event concludes with closing remarks from the presenter.

4. Diplomas and Certificates (Participants, Referees, Volunteers, Achievements)

All participants, referees, and volunteers at the European Universities Padel Championship will receive certificates recognizing their contribution. Volunteers can also obtain an open badge for academic credits or official recognition in schools. This system promotes appreciation and support within the university sports community.

VI. PROTOCOL & CEREMONIES

1. Opening Ceremony

Opening Ceremony - July 28, 20:30 | Pátio das Escolas

The Opening Ceremony will last approximately 90 minutes. The event will start at 20:30 with a short opening video, followed by a welcome from the presenter and introductions of dignitaries. The Parade of Delegations (athletes and officials) will then take place.

Speeches will be delivered by the Organising Committee President, FADU President, and the University of Coimbra Rector. A gymnastics performance by AAC will follow.

Afterward, the EUSA Representative and a Host Country official will give opening speeches and officially declare the Championships open. The Portuguese national anthem will be played, followed by the oaths from an athlete and referee. The EUSA flag will be raised as “Gaudeamus Igitur” plays. The evening concludes with a traditional Fado performance and a group photo.

The event will feature cultural and architectural highlights of the venue, involvement of the mascot DUC, and volunteers in traditional University of Coimbra attire.



2. Closing Ceremony

Closing Ceremony - August 1 & 3 | Tennis & Padel Venues

The Closing Ceremony will last around 60 minutes and follow the medal award ceremonies. It will include acknowledgements of teams, volunteers, and sponsors, and a video recap of event highlights.

There will be a final Parade of Delegations and Volunteers, followed by closing speeches from the Organising Committee and EUSA representatives. A symbolic bouquet will be presented to a volunteer representative.

The ceremony will conclude with the Flag Handover, as the EUSA flag is lowered and passed to the next host, who will then give a short welcome speech. A Tuna music group will perform the final cultural act.

Throughout, the mascot DUC will be present, and the ceremonies will emphasize cultural heritage, sportsmanship, and international unity.

3. Social and Cultural Activities

Athletes are welcome to enjoy the social life every day from 9 PM at the AAC gardens and the AAC bar. These are great spots to relax, meet other participants, and enjoy the atmosphere throughout the event. There will always be someone from the event team present, easily identifiable by their event t-shirt.

6.Anti-doping Policy

Doping is not a guarantee of success in sport. In fact, its effect is usually the opposite. A lot of elite sportsmen and sportswomen who did doping got caught. As a result, they lost pride and were banned for at least 2 years from participating in a sport they loved and lived for. An even bigger problem of doping are the effects on the body.

In elite sports, doping is defined as a violation of one or more anti-doping rules:

1. Presence of a prohibited substance in an athlete's sample
2. Use or attempted use of a prohibited substance or method
3. Refusing to submit sample collection after being notified
4. Failure to file athlete whereabouts information & missed tests
5. Tampering with any part of the doping control process
6. Possession of a prohibited substance or method
7. Trafficking a prohibited substance or method
8. Administering or attempting to administer a prohibited substance or method to an athlete

You can find the list of prohibited substances and methods on the internet, as it is updated every year by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) and it's valid for every sport.

EUSA is active in Anti-Doping promotion, and has been a partner in the European Anti-Doping Initiative (EADIn) and Match point, supporting European-wide Anti-Doping mentality in the youth sector by establishing a moral tenor towards concepts such as Fair-play, sensitizing and raising awareness on all levels of the complex social environment surrounding the doping problematic, and implementing strategies to motivate young people to pass on the message and create a strong multiplying effect. Also, the International University Sport Federation (FISU) has been actively promoting sports without drugs, also at the university sports level.

EUSA is currently not enforcing doping tests at our events. In accordance with the national legislation of the host countries, however, doping controls may be implemented by the National Anti-Doping Agencies. If such doping tests are executed, the WADA rules and regulations are applicable to all athletes. Please remember that testing can be conducted in-competition and out-of-competition. If you are identified in a Registered Testing Pool (RTP), you must provide current and accurate whereabouts information.

What can you do to be an excellent athlete?

- Practice right and live healthy
 - Get more information about the consequences of Doping
 - Play fair and be a good role model to younger athletes
 - Be committed to sport without doping
- Doping? No, thanks!



7. Fair Play

Fair play is a core value of EUSA, deeply embedded in our mission and activities. In partnership with the European Fair Play Movement (EFPM), we actively promote sportsmanship, respect, and solidarity at all our events. For over 20 years, EUSA has championed these values, recognising fair play as the true essence of sport.

Fair play is present in sports as the unwritten rule, a moral value that represents the real essence of sport. It represents that opponents must be appreciated and in nowadays practising of sports, more than ever, it is vitally important to defend the values intrinsic to sport: respect for oneself and others, solidarity, and fair play.

Since 2007, EUSA has honoured outstanding acts of fair play with the Enno Harms Fair Play Award, named after the first EUSA President and a strong advocate for fair play. At each event, organisers, delegates, and participants commit to upholding fair play, with the oath of respect and integrity declared during the opening ceremonies.

The prestigious annual EUSA Enno Harms Fair Play Award is awarded to athletes demonstrating fair play during the matches, following the rules, and pursuing a “clean” game, and is awarded with a fair play recognition already during the event. EUSA Executive Committee members discuss the proposals received from all sporting events governed by EUSA in that year and select the team or individual to receive the Enno Harms Fair Play award, which is formally handed to them at a special occasion, usually at the EUSA Gala.

Fair play will remain a key focus at the European Universities Championships 2025.

Guided by EUSA's principles and the Olympic spirit, our events promote respect, equality, and non-discrimination, contributing to a more inclusive and peaceful society through sport.

We kindly invite all delegations to submit proposals for the Enno Harms Fair Play Award, recognising individuals or university teams who have demonstrated exemplary behaviour, integrity, and sportsmanship during the Championships.

1. Technical Regulations

The delegation will consist of minimum 2 (two), maximum 4 (four) athletes and maximum 3 (three) officials. The head of delegation must be appointed

2. International Regulations and Exceptions

The Competition will be held in accordance with the following Tennis Rules, the ITF Duties and Procedures for Officials, and any other rules, policies or documents issued by the ITF from time to time that apply according to their terms to the Competition, each as amended from time to time. Unless specified otherwise, the provisions in the Rules and Regulations apply to all levels of the Competition.

3. Eligibility to Play (accreditation, age limit etc.)

According to European Universities Championships Rules & Regulation in the Eligibility point we can find that:

- Participants shall be nominated through their NUSA. If no team/competitor is nominated by a NUSA in defined term, EUSA may accept an entry directly from a University or individual athlete, but is obliged to inform the respective NUSA. Non members of EUSA may enter via a reserve list; a higher fee might be imposed.
- Only the following may participate as competitors:
 - Students who are officially registered for and pursuing a course of study at: university, or similar institute with the status as an institution of higher education recognised by the appropriate national authority of their country. Participation of university teams from disputed territories is possible only for universities recognized either by the European University Association or the International Association of Universities. Such Universities may only compete under their University and EUSA flag. Students shall confirm their status by delivering completed, signed and sealed EUSA Certificate of Academic Eligibility (Individual Entry);
 - Former students of the institutions mentioned above who obtained their academic degree or diploma in the year preceding the EUC;
 - Competitor's age is defined by the formula: the EUC Year - competitor's year of birth = age. According to this formula competitor shall not be younger than 17 and older than 30 years.
 - If the official(s) of a delegation deliberately misinform the SCAC Chair about the eligibility of competitor(s), the participant and the team of the sport concerned will be excluded from further participation in the current event: such fraud may give grounds for the termination of that country's membership of EUSA.

X. COMPETITION INFORMATION

1. Competition Format

The competition consists of 6 (six) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of delegation is mandatory, will be the competition.

Draw, seeding

Technical Handbook EUG 2025 Draw, seeding The draw will be done in the presence of EUSA Representative taking into account ATP / WTA / ITF and EUSA Tennis ranking, The university team of the hosting city or, in their absence the hosting countrys highest ranked team will be placed on first (1) place in pool A. Teams from the same country shall, whenever possible, be placed in different pools.

Mode of play

- 5 minutes warm-up before the match
- Ball change: 4 new balls for third set group stage and QF, SF and finals 9/11
- 1 player/captain is allowed to sit on an chair at the court

Men's competition:

Round-robin of 16 teams, split into four round-robin groups with four teams in each.
4RR-groups of 4 Teams: 3 matches (2 Singles and 1 Doubles).

Followed by:

8 teams elimination draw, 3 rounds (QF, SF and Final) = 3 matches (2 Singles and 1 Doubles) = 3 days.

The 16 teams are drawn, considering the distribution of teams from the same country, into eight (4) groups of four (4) teams, who will play against each other in a round robin format.

Women's competition:

Round Robin of 12 Teams, split into three round-robin groups of 4 teams
3 RR-groups of 4 Teams: 3 matches (2 Singles and 1 Doubles).

Followed by:

6 teams elimination draw, 3 rounds

(QF, SF and Final) = 3 matches (2 Singles and 1 Doubles) = 3 days.

The Quarter-Finals Draw will consist of the three winners and three second-place teams of round-robin groups

Mode of play

- 5 minutes warm-up before the match
- Ball change: 4 new balls for third set group stage and QF, SF and finals 9/11
- 1 player/captain is allowed to sit on an chair at the court

Group stage matches will be played as follows:

- Single matches: Best of three (3) tie-break sets.
- Doubles matches: Best of three (3), no ad, 3rd set is a 10-point match tie break.

Scoring format: All matches will be best of 3 tie break sets with regular scoring. In the case of ties, tiebreakers will be automatically sorted based on:

1. Greatest Number of wins
2. Head to head result if only two players are tied
3. % of Matches won
4. % of sets won
5. % of games won
6. Coin toss

Determining Semifinal Seeding from Group Winners

The teams that finish first in each group will advance and a mini-table, the mini-table will be created among these three group winners. Their final ranking in this mini-table will be determined according to the criteria listed below.

1. Greatest Number of wins
2. % of Matches won
3. % of sets won
4. % of games won
5. Coin toss

The top two teams in this mini-ranking will be directly seeded into the semifinals, while the third team will compete in the quarterfinals.

This rule will also be applied to determine the seeding for the 9th-12th place playoffs, using the same logic for the teams that finished third in each group.

2. Competition and Training Program

The competition consists of 6 (six) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of delegation is mandatory, will be the competition.

Women competition

There will be three matches in the morning, starting at 9:00 AM, and three matches in the afternoon, played not before 2:00 PM.

Men competition

There will be five matches in the morning, starting at 9:00 AM, and three matches in the afternoon, played not before 2:00 PM.
